1. Recent events:

3. AOB

- a. As noted in the last newsletter, Peter Fielding and Keith Johnston have agreed to act as clerk of the course and event secretary for a 100th anniversary commemoration of the 1925 ISDT the Commemorative run, on Sunday 10th August, will follow a route from Barford St. Martin nr. Salisbury to Cheddar, with many sections as used in 1925 (set up as a 75 mile tarmac route with 14 miles of optional off-road sections) and will be open to VMCC-eligible girder-fork or rigid rear end machines. The aim is pre-war machines, or machines in the spirit of the event. Navigation will be by route book. A recovery van has been arranged to support the event, recovering breakdowns to Cheddar. Keith noted there has been a good response with a total of 29 entrants so far, 18 on pre-war machines.
